Categories and Information 2024 Procession Participants

FLOAT CATEGORIES

Floral Float:

A float that features paper flowers, is 3m or larger and may carry a Princess.

Educational Floats:

A category to feature the efforts by local schools, kindergartens and early childhood centres, and other providers of education and out of school care. This may include children walking in costume. Floats will be judged on the day.

Contemporary Floats:

The category that encourages creativity and design. Floats in this category do not need to be made in the traditional manner and may carry a Princess.

Small Floral Float:

A small float featuring flowers and built on a single axel domestic trailer.

Vehicles and other entries:

This category covers sports clubs, vehicles, and parade entries other than floats. <u>Please note</u>: No commercial vehicles are allowed in the procession unless used as a towing vehicle.

\$750 Donation to your club, school, or kindergarten as a fundraising incentive to participate in this years festival. Private business and others we will donate \$750 to a charity of your choice, (T and C apply)

- All floats are eligible up to \$500 GST incl. reimbursement for costs of materials. Please find application form attached.
- Each float entry will receive a maximum of 10 complimentary entry tickets to Saturday in the Park.
- A float can be entered by a school, childcare centres and kindergartens, community groups, business house, sports club or by individuals.

- "Men's Sheds" (a group of experienced handymen) have volunteered to help community organisations build their floats. "Men's Sheds" have a variety of experience in the engineering and building trades and will help out with the construction of floats. Waste Minimisation

When designing your float, please consider the following:

Reduce – Reuse - Recycle

- <u>Reduce</u> Can your float be built with less stuff? The 'less is more' principle.
- <u>Reuse</u> Can your materials be stored and used again next year? Can you use preloved materials; there are many interesting items available at WasteBusters.
- <u>Recycle</u> Can you break down your float into its various components ready for recycling? So long as they are separated, recyclers will take metal, cardboard, paper and plastic.

Float builders are responsible for the cost of all rubbish taken to the Transfer Station

Rethinking the design of your float, reusing last years materials, and constructing your float in a way that can easily be undone and recycled, will help you save money and use resources more wisely.

Important information for Float Conveners

When you choose a Princess for your float, please pass on the following details to them

Entrants must be 16 to 25 years as of 1st September, the year of the festival

We realise it's not easy to find young people willing to go on floats, but it's been found over the years, those aged 16 years and over have greater maturity and are able to present themselves and your float to the best advantage. If you are unable to find a contestant, contact the Princess Convener (Dianne Eliot 448 6614) who may be able to assist.

Your Princess should be proud to represent your organisation and Alexandra and must be aware of their commitments in the weeks leading up to the Blossom Festival, and what is required should they become the Festival Queen.

There are certain compulsory duties required of each contestant the weeks prior to Blossom Festival, such as the photograph session; official judging and lunch; Senior Queen Competition and the official opening function. These are all occasions when the judges will be observing the contestants as part of the judging process. The procession and Official Ceremony on the Saturday afternoon are the highlight of the weekend.

There are other occasions, which (whilst not compulsory), are beneficial and an important part of Blossom Festival, such as their appearance at the Mardi gras, and the Round the Clock Event on Friday night. There may be other events that the contestants will be notified about.

The three successful contestants have duties which they are required to perform and events which they must attend during the week following their crowning. These include appearance at the Musical Society's production, and attending the Garden Tour (Sunday)

At each function, the Queen and the two runners up finalists will be accompanied by either the Chairperson of the Blossom Festival Committee, or the Princess/Prince Convener. On all occasions, sashes must be worn. For some of the events, smart casual attire such as jeans is allowed. On others, more appropriate clothing is required. If in doubt, ask the Princess/Prince Convener. Please ensure that your contestant is available the week 20th September through to Friday the 30th of September.

The contestants will be judged by a panel of judges; Float conveners are reminded that once the floats are in the park, Princesses and Princes are required to remain on the floats until the voting closes at 3.00 pm. Please ensure that someone from your organisation is responsible for ensuring your contestant has coats or wraps if the weather is cooler, as well as bottles of water.

The Committee wishes your organisation and your contestant, good luck for this year's Blossom Festival.

Sunday 15th September:

11.00 am Official Photo Session, Lanes Dam, top of Aronui Road. (Let Donald know how many contestants - 448 9448)

Sunday, 22nd September:

1.00 pm Judging. Living Options Centre, Ngapara Street (heading towards the Cemetery, complex on right). This is the formal part of the judging, and encompasses your personality as well as your appearance, so a tidy appearance is recommended. (Depending on number of contestants, this may be earlier and involve a light lunch. You will be notified if this is the case).

Tuesday, 24th September:

2.00 pm Senior Blossom Queen Contest, Alexandra District Club (contestants to find their own way there and meet Dianne outside at 1.45 pm). MC will introduce them and the floats they represent. Reasonable standard of clothing required.

Wednesday, 25th September:

6.45 pm Blossom Festival Art Exhibition, Central Stories, Centennial Avenue. Contestants to find their own way there - meet with Dianne outside at 6.30pm. Mingle with guests. MC may mention you by name – no speaking parts! Reasonable standard of clothing required.

hursday 26th September

2.15 pm Visit to rest homes to talk to residents. Meet outside to go in as a group. MASKS WILL BE SUPPLIED IF REQUIRED.

2.30 pm	Castlewood, Tarbert Street (Virginia)
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3.00 pm Ranui, Chapple Street. (Leigh McLeod)

Friday 27th September:

- 3.00pm High tea at Living Options (time and details to be confirmed) new event for 2024?
- 6.00 pm Attend the Mardi Gras at River Street, beside the old swimming pool reserve area in Thompson Street Report to the stage where you will be introduced to the public. This is strictly informal dress warmly and sensibly and just wear your sashes.

Saturday, 28th September:

12.00 pm Procession. Assemble at Floats in Killarney Street, at 10.30 am (or when your float convener says to be there) ready for 12 noon start. You are required to stay on your float until **2.30 pm** unless the weather turns bad then I'll decide for you to get off early. Once off the floats, make your way to Central Stories for afternoon tea, or have a look around the floats, being back at the main stage at **3.15pm** ready for the crowning ceremony at **3.30 pm**.

DUTIES FOR THREE WINNERS

Saturday 28th September:

7.30 pm Attendance at the Musical Society's production of ????" for the three winners. Meet Dianne outside Theatre by 7.15 pm **at the latest**. (Three tickets plus chaperone).

Sunday, 29th September:

1.00 pm Garden Tour. Meet outside Central Stories at 12.45pm Depending on the number of gardens, finish 4 – 4.30 pm.

Note – parents or supporters are most welcome to come as support if you wish, but they would need to purchase garden tour tickets and travel in their own cars.

On all occasions, sashes must be worn. For some of the events, casual attire such as jeans, are allowed. On others, more appropriate clothing is required. If in doubt, ask the Princess Convener.
